As part of our academic curriculum and industrial exposure program, a group of 53 students accompanied by 4 faculty members visited KG Fabrics, a prominent unit of Sri Kannapiran Mills, located in SIPCOT Industrial Estate, Perundurai, Erode District.

Sri Kannapiran Mills is a reputed player in the Indian textile industry, known for quality, sustainability, and technological advancement. KG Fabrics, one of its major units, specializes in the production of woven fabrics and supplies both domestic and international markets. The unit is well-equipped with modern machinery and operates in compliance with global standards. Mr. Arjunan, General Manager – Production, spent his valuable time and guided the students.

During the plant tour, we had the opportunity to witness:

1. Spinning Division: Conversion of raw fibers into yarn using automated machinery.
2. Weaving Unit: Fabric formation using high-speed looms such as air-jet and rapier looms.
3. Dyeing & Finishing: Use of eco-friendly dyes and modern finishing processes.
4. Quality Assurance: In-line quality checks at each stage of production.
5. Environmental Practices: Operation of an Effluent Treatment Plant (ETP) ensuring sustainable manufacturing.
6. Safety & Hygiene: Strict compliance with industrial safety and cleanliness standards.

The visit provided deep insight into:

- i. Industrial production planning and control.
- iii. Professional workplace environment and safety norms.

Following the industrial visit, we proceeded to Shivan Malai, a renowned spiritual site in the region. We offered our prayers and took a moment for personal reflection and gratitude.

On 20th June, the students of **Grade IX** went on an educational field trip to **Pillur Hydro Power Project**. The journey towards Pillur began at 7.45 a.m. The trip was organized to help students learn about renewable energy and understand how hydroelectric power is generated.

During the visit, the students were given a guided tour of the power plant. They saw the dam, the turbines, and the control room where electricity is managed. The engineer of the plant explained the working of the hydro power project, including how water from the river is used to produce electricity without causing pollution.

Students also learned about the importance of conserving energy and using renewable sources to protect the environment. The trip was both informative and enjoyable, giving the students practical knowledge that complemented their science lessons.

The students returned to school in the evening around 6.00 p.m. motivated to learn more about sustainable energy solutions.

As part of the experiential learning initiative, a one-day educational field visit was organized for the **Grade X students to Ooty**. The itinerary included three major scientific and industrial centers: The **Tata Institute of Fundamental Research (TIFR) – Cosmic Ray Laboratory**, the **Radio Astronomy Centre**, and the **Doddabetta Tea Factory and Tea Museum, chocolate factory**. The trip provided a rich learning experience by exposing students to both cutting-edge scientific research and large-scale industrial processes.

### **1. Tata Institute of Fundamental Research (TIFR) – Cosmic Ray Laboratory**

The first visit was the **Cosmic Ray Laboratory** at TIFR, a prestigious Indian research institute established in 1945 by Dr. Homi Bhabha with support from the Sir Dorabji Tata Trust.

TIFR operates under the Department of Atomic Energy and is renowned for its work in fundamental sciences including mathematics, physics, biology, and chemistry. The institute's interdisciplinary approach and lack of departmental divisions make it a unique center for scientific learning and innovation.

At the laboratory, a resident scientist explained key concepts related to **cosmic rays, supernova explosions, and subatomic particles** such as **photons and muons**. Students were then taken to the **Muon Telescope Centre**, where they were introduced to its working principles and its role in detecting secondary particles resulting from cosmic ray interactions.

The session highlighted the research legacy that began in 1955 under B.V. Sreekantan, initially using cloud chambers to study cosmic rays. Over time, this evolved into sophisticated experiments on high-energy particle interactions. The visit helped students understand the scientific techniques used to explore cosmic phenomena and their broader astrophysical significance.

## **2. Radio Astronomy Centre – Ooty Radio Telescope (ORT)**

The next destination was the **Ooty Radio Telescope (ORT)**, located in Muthurai near Ooty. The telescope's unique design was finalized in 1963, leveraging the geographic and geomagnetic advantages of the site. Construction began in 1965, and the telescope became fully operational in 1971.

The ORT is a landmark in India's space research history. In 1992, it underwent significant technological upgrades, including the implementation of **phased array feeds** and **GaAsFET low-noise amplifiers**, which greatly improved its sensitivity. In 2017, the telescope was further transformed into the **Ooty Wide Field Array (OWFA)**-a 264-element interferometric array that now contributes to advanced research in **heliospheric physics, 21 cm intensity mapping**, and **transient radio phenomena**.



During the visit, students toured the facility, observed the telescope's operational mechanisms, and learned about its historical and scientific significance. They were captivated by the idea of detecting and interpreting radio waves from distant celestial bodies to better understand the universe. A video presentation further enhanced their grasp of these complex concepts.

### 3. Doddabetta Tea Factory, Tea Museum & Chocolate Factory

The final stop was the **Doddabetta Tea Factory and Tea Museum**, located at an altitude of 1,839 meters on Doddabetta Road. This segment of the tour offered a fascinating look into the industrial process of tea production—an important economic activity in the Nilgiris.

Students witnessed the entire tea manufacturing process, from **plucking tea leaves** to **drying and packaging**. They were also introduced to the **CTC (Cutting, Twisting, Curling)** method of tea processing. The **Tea Museum** presented the rich history of tea in India, particularly in the Nilgiris, and showcased both traditional and modern machinery used for **withering, rolling, fermenting, drying, and sifting** the tea leaves.

After the informative tour, students were given the opportunity to purchase **factory-made chocolates** and other products. They concluded their visit by enjoying the **drizzling evening view of Thoottabetta**, which added a refreshing and scenic finish to the day.

The field trip provided an enriching blend of scientific exploration and industrial understanding. Students gained firsthand insights into cosmic ray physics and radio astronomy, while also developing an appreciation for the intricate processes involved in tea production. This experience not only deepened their academic knowledge but also sparked a greater curiosity about science and industry in India.

A field trip was conducted on **20<sup>th</sup> & 21<sup>st</sup> June 2025** for a group of **grade XI science 44 students** accompanied by **5 teachers** namely Mrs.L.Jeevitha, Mrs.Bhanu Rekha, Mr.M.Pushparaj, Ms.Nivetha and Mr.Vimal Kumar for a trip to Trivandrum (Kerala).

**Day 1(20.06.2025):** On the first day, we visited the **Vikram Sarabhai Space Centre (VSSC) Space Museum** in Trivandrum. The museum showcases India's achievements in space exploration. Students explored models of rockets and satellites, viewed multimedia presentations, and interacted with exhibits detailing ISRO's history and missions. The experience greatly enriched their understanding of space science and technology. Later, we visited **Kovalam Beach** for relaxation and to observe the marine environment.

**Day 2(21.06.2025):** On the second day, students visited the **Padmanabha Swamy Temple**, appreciating its spiritual significance and traditional Kerala architecture. They then explored the **Priyadarshini Planetarium**, viewing dome shows on astronomy and India's space missions like **Chandrayaan** and **Mangalyaan**, followed by hands-on learning at the **Science & Technology Museum** through interactive exhibits and the **Fun Science Gallery**. The day concluded with visits to the **Trivandrum Zoo**, home to diverse animal species, and the **Art Gallery** showcasing various art forms. It was a well-rounded educational and cultural experience that enriched students' knowledge and curiosity.

**Day 1:**

**Grade XI and XII management** students were taken to a field visit to **Thalavady farm land** on 20th June 2025. Thalavadi is a hilly taluk in Erode district, Tamil Nadu, adjoining the Karnataka border. It lies within the Eastern Ghats, near the confluence of Western and Eastern Ghats and the Sathyamangalam Tiger Reserve. Thalavadi enjoys a moderate climate and

experiences mixed cropping systems that include coffee, pepper, black plum, gooseberry, banana, and various vegetables like broad beans, bitter melon, ivy gourd. On the farm, students examined varied agricultural practices, noting the use of drip irrigation, borewell systems, sprinklers and multi-crop farming strategies adapted to the area's rocky, forest-adjacent landscapes. They also observed conservation efforts where villagers worked to mitigate wildlife conflict, such as elephant and tiger incursions. The vegetables were mainly taken to Erode and to markets in Trissur and Cochin.

The students also visited Namdhari seeds Pvt Ltd which was established in 1985. Their journey began with contract seed production for various nations across the globe, their successes driven them to research into developing hybrid crops, pioneering hybrid seed production in India. Today, they produce hybrid seeds that prioritize adaptability, disease resistance and superior consumer appeal.

From a management perspective, students evaluated the strengths—rich biodiversity, community cooperation, and crop variety—and identified significant weaknesses such as unreliable water access, fragmented road infrastructure, and wildlife-related risks.

The Thalavadi field visit presented a comprehensive learning platform—where management principles intersect with environmental stewardship and rural dynamics. Students gained first-hand exposure to real-world challenges, from handling operational risks and supply-chain planning to navigating multi-stakeholder relationships in border agro-ecosystems.

## **Day 2:**

The next day (21.06.25) students had the opportunity to explore some of the city's most iconic attractions, each offering a unique experience. Students first stop was the **Mysore Zoo**, one of the oldest and well-maintained zoos in India. It was home to a wide variety of animals, including endangered species, and offered an educational experience about wildlife conservation. Walking through the lush greenery of the zoo, students encountered lions, tigers, elephants, and many exotic birds.

The next place of visit was **Chamundeshwari Temple** by students proved to be both educational and spiritually enriching. Situated atop the Chamundi Hill in Mysore, the temple is dedicated to Goddess Chamundeshwari, an incarnation of Goddess Durga.

Next we visited **St. Philomena's Church**, one of the largest churches in India. The neo-gothic architecture, with its towering spires and beautiful stained glass windows, was awe-inspiring. The peaceful ambiance inside the church provided a serene contrast to the liveliness of the other attractions.

Late in the afternoon the students visited **Mysore Palace**, a magnificent structure known for its Indo-Saracenic architecture. Inside, the grand Durbar Hall, royal rooms, and intricate carvings reflected the opulence of the Wodeyar dynasty.

Lastly, in the evening, we traveled to **Brindavan Gardens**, about 30 km from Mysore, known for its sprawling layout and stunning illuminated fountains. The highlight of the visit was the **laser light show**, which brought the fountains to life with synchronized lights and music. It was a magical experience, and the vibrant colors against the night sky made it even more memorable.

Altogether, the trip to Mysore was an unforgettable journey, offering a perfect blend of history, culture, nature, and spirituality.

Teachers were encouraged to weave SEL practices into daily classroom activities to build empathy, resilience, and ethical decision-making among students.

**Internal Assessment:** A significant portion of the orientation focused on the internal assessment components, which include listening and speaking skills evaluation, multiple assessments (e.g., quizzes, oral tests), and special assignments and projects.

02.07.2025 The Kovai Sahodaya Schools Complex successfully organized a one-day **Computer Science Workshop on 2nd July 2025 at PSG Public Schools, Coimbatore.** The workshop was facilitated by **Mrs. Meenakshi R, Computer Science faculty at PSG Public Schools. Ms.Nandhini, PGT attended the workshop from our school.**

The session saw the enthusiastic participation of **13 teachers** from various schools under the Sahodaya cluster. The primary focus of the workshop was to enhance pedagogical practices, align classroom teaching with **21st-**

**century skills**, and integrate technology effectively into computer science education.

### Objectives of the Workshop

- To explore and implement diverse **pedagogical approaches** suitable for Computer Science.
- To align **Computer Science curriculum** with **21st-century skills**.
- To understand and apply **active learning, experiential learning, and competency-based learning** in the classroom.
- To discuss methods for integrating **higher Order Thinking Skills (HOTS)** into daily lessons.
- To equip teachers with **handful of programs, case studies, and cybersecurity activities**.
- To introduce **AI tools** like **Teachy** and **Teach.AI** that support effective teaching and learning.
- To familiarize educators with **MakeCode Arcade**, especially for **students of Grade VI**.
- To guide teachers in setting question papers aligned with **Bloom's Taxonomy**.
- To reflect on the **vision, mission, and objectives of SQAAF** (School Quality Assessment and Accreditation Framework).

### Highlights of the Workshop

**\*Session 2 – ICT Integration in Mathematics\***

She then elaborated on several key points to keep in mind while setting question papers:

- Avoid common errors, including spelling mistakes.
- Understand the difference between similar concepts—for example, equidistance vs. midpoint formula, and how such confusion can affect question clarity.

- A good question must:
  - Test both conceptual understanding and skills.
  - free from errors.
  - age-appropriate, using clear and concise language.
  - Avoid trivial or irrelevant details.

Following this, each group was instructed to prepare a set of questions, including:

- MCQ 1 & 2
- Assess & Reason (1 each)
- One 2-mark, 3-mark, 5-mark question
- One case-based question

Mr. Vijay led focusing on constructivism and constructivist teaching strategies. He explained how to plan SMART learning outcomes and highlighted the key differences between learning objectives and learning outcomes.

He also emphasized how SMART outcomes can guide us in implementing the LARR cycle. Further, he discussed how to assess the 20 internal marks through structured rubrics using components like:

- Subject Enrichment Activities
- Portfolio
- Multiple Assessments
- Periodic Tests

Final Session Summary – Capacity Building Programme (Mathematics – Secondary)

The final session focused on analyzing compartment question papers in alignment with Bloom's Taxonomy. Each question was categorized under the appropriate cognitive level — Remembering, Understanding, Applying,

Analyzing, Evaluating, and Creating — and discussions were held on why questions fall under each level.

The program concluded with a collective assessment of the two-day workshop, followed by reflections and feedback from all participants.

The session introduced teachers to the platform's features, demonstrated its benefits for classroom and administrative management, and provided hands-on guidance to ensure smooth adoption. 3. **Eligibility Criteria:** Students who got passed are eligible can appear for the first exam. Those who need to improve their scores can appear for the second exam.

5. **Internal Assessment:** Internal assessment will be conducted only once before the main examination.
6. **Result Declaration:** The result of the first exam will be declared in April, and the second exam result will be declared after the May examination.
7. **Mark Statement and Merit Certificate:** Mark statements will be available on Digilocker, and merit certificates will be issued based on the best scores.

**Additional Initiatives:**
